#### The year in review

#### Off season

There weren't that many squad changes over the winter. Jenna decided her health problems meant she had to retire. Rachael stepped away from the game, Rob moved from Wednesday to Tuesday with Matt moving the other way. New girls Nayaab and Charlotte were recruited from the winter indoor sessions. Immediately before the start of the season Steph decided to leave and Harry joined Matt in the Wednesday team. Dave stepped down as Tigers captain with Simon eventually emerging as his replacement. Immediately before the start of the season Leon signed up and proved an invaluable addition to the Tiggers roster.

#### **Division 2**

We had a fast start to the season, a mid season hiccup where we lost 4 of 5 games and then a strong finish. All culminating in a second place finish and promotion to Division 1. We scored more runs than any other team in the division and were the second best team at preventing runs.

#### **Division 3**

We had a much more successful campaign than in 2023. We won 7 games and lost 8.
